Dr. Joel Schuman, Chairman of Ophthalmology



This was a very good year for UPMC Eye Center. We have added new programs, expanded existing ones and increased our clinical volumes. The resident match went well and we added new faculty. Several faculty received new National Institutes of Health (NIH) grants and have renewed existing grants. Finally, faculty members were recognized for their research and outreach accomplishments.

AYEAR IN REVIEW FROM THE CHAIRS

Despite our success in obtaining NIH funding, the reduction in government allocations to the NIH and the sequester increased the difficulty of obtaining grants. While scientists are receiving excellent scores, scores that would have been funded in past years, the lack of funds available at the NIH means that many outstanding grants go unfunded. Support from philanthropic individuals and from the Eye & Ear Foundation is more important than ever in the current funding environment. It is only through this sort of support that we will identify new cures for eye disease. Such support is needed to prevent promising research programs having to close down. This support also enables the initiation of creative new research projects that are the most difficult to fund through any other source, especially through the NIH.

I would like to highlight a couple of successes this year. One is the work of James L. Funderburgh, PhD, who discovered a corneal stromal stem cell approximately 10 years ago. His work, a fundamental scientific insight, led to a number of basic science studies. Over the past two years, Jim Funderburgh has been collaborating with LV Prasad Eye Institute in Hyderabad, India. A clinician scientist from LV Prasad Eye Institute spent a year in the Funderburgh laboratory. This scientist decided to spend time learning from Professor Funderburgh and has now returned to India to conduct clinical trials using the stem cells that Professor Funderburgh discovered. This is an example of translational science at its purest. A basic scientist in our department made a fundamental discovery, continued research in that area increasing

scientific knowledge related to the discovery, and then his work was picked-up by a clinician scientist who was trained by that basic scientist and now has taken that fundamental discovery into the clinical realm with the hope of improving the health of the population. This stem cell clears corneal scars and opacities in mice. The question being addressed in India is whether or not it will do the same in people.

Another faculty member I wish to highlight is Evan "Jake" Waxman, MD, PhD, who won accolades from multiple sources as well as awards for his work and outreach in the Pittsburgh area. Jake's efforts on behalf of the underserved in Pittsburgh are being recognized by the community, and his teaching passion and skill is being applauded as well. And rightfully so! Jake is an outstanding educator as well as a compassionate and thoughtful physician. This year Jake Waxman was chosen as the 2013 Jefferson Award winner for his work with the Guerilla Eye Service, was awarded the Kenneth E. Schuit Award (which recognized the Dean's Master Educators), was elected into the Charles G. Watson Chapter of the Arnold P. Gold Humanism Honor Society and was the 2013 recipient of the Leonard Tow Humanism in Medicine faculty award presented by the Arnold Gold Foundation.

As always I wish you the very best for the holidays, and sign off in the knowledge that the UPMC Eye Center continues to grow, and that we continue to do the good work that we have pledged to perform.

The faculty members of the Department of Otolaryngology have enjoyed a productive year and have seen our efforts to translate scientific discoveries from our laboratories to impact patient care reach a new high.

Dr. Doyle and his colleagues at Children's Hospital successfully renewed their NIH funded program to study "middle ear pressure regulation in health and disease." Physicians and investigators in our department have been leaders in the field of eustachian tube function and how dysfunction of this membranous tube connecting the middle ear to the back of the nose contributes to infections of the middle ear (known as otitis media). This is a large program that supports a number of projects and core studies dedicated to characterizing regulatory mechanisms of middle ear aeration in patients and control populations. Their important efforts will allow us to more effectively prevent and treat infections of the middle ear, which remain a major public health problem, particularly in pediatric populations.

Dr. Maria Rubio, a member of our auditory science research group received funding for her new NIH grant to study "anatomical and functional properties of auditory nerve synapses." This important work represents collaboration with other members of the group to improve our understanding of hearing with the ultimate goal of preventing and treating hearing loss. In our balance disorders (vestibular sciences) group, Dr. McCall, a young physician scientist received funding to study "the influence of dynamic limb movement on activity within the vestibular nuclei". Meanwhile, Dr. Gandhi was awarded NIH R01 funding for his work on the "neuronal"

basis of saccade preparation." Both of these research projects are aimed at increasing our understanding of dizziness and imbalance, conditions which afflict a large number of patients in our region.

Our head and neck cancer team continues its efforts to prevent and treat this lethal malignancy. Dr. Ferris and colleagues are working to better understand the tumor microenvironment with an emphasis on assessing the efficacy of new immunotherapies, which are leading to remarkable clinical responses in other cancers. Drs. Kim, Duvvuri, Egloff, and Grandis are developing innovative strategies to target novel signaling pathways and integrating these new approaches with our increased understanding of the heterogeneous genetic underpinnings of this cancer.

Our young trainees have had enormous success this year receiving support from the Howard Hughes Medical Research Institute, the American Head and Neck Society and the NIH to support their important projects in otolaryngology related diseases.
